

## **Burn Permit Application**

A burn permit is required year-round and is a formal authorization required by the City of Whittier, Alaska, under Whittier Municipal Code 8.08.020, for the open burning of combustible materials. This includes burning in approved burn barrels. Permits are obtainable from the Fire Department and are granted at the discretion of the Fire Chief or other authorized personnel. The purpose of a burn permit is to ensure that open burning activities are conducted safely and responsibly, with consideration for public health, safety, and the protection of property. It is the responsibility of the individual conducting the burn, whether permitted or not, to prevent any damage resulting from the fire. Additionally, the Fire Chief may impose restrictions, revoke, or refuse to issue permits under certain weather or hazardous conditions to safeguard the community's well-being.

A person may use a barbecue and burn a campfire in an established metal ring or a containerized fire pit (fire pan) without a burning permit.

Be over the age of eighteen years old.		
Must read the permit in its entirety before actively burning.		
Sign, date, and put the location you are burning at on the permit.		
Call Whittier Dispatch each day before burning at (907) 472-2340.		
Have the permit on you when burning.		

Construct a firebreak at least 15' wide of non-combustible material (dirt, gravel, sand, etc.) before igniting		
the fire.		
Do NOT burn during adverse weather conditions (hot, dry, windy): https://www.weather.gov/arh/.		
Ensure the prevailing wind direction is away from any structure or roadway and the open burn is conducted		
during a period of adequate air movement.		
Ensure the fire is no closer than 50' to any structure and prevent the spread of fire to any other structure or		
property;		
This permit only allows you to burn organic/wood debris, paper, and cardboard.		
This permit only allows you to operate ONE burn barrel at a time, burn less than ONE acre of maintained		
grass less 4" in height, OR burn ONE brush pile less than 5' in diameter by 3' in height at a time.		
Have a sufficient water supply to immediately extinguish the fire and tools close by while burning.		
Extinguish the fire before sunset.		
Failure to follow the guidelines established on the Burn Permit or that violate Whittier Municipal Code or		
Wildland Fire Protection Statutes and Regulations may result in a Citation and/or further legal action.
